

Essay on Turag River In Bangladesh

The river is a tributary of the Buriganga Turag tip, a major river in Bangladesh. The river originates in the Turag Bangshi, the latter one of the largest tributaries of the river flows through Dhaleshwari Gazipur District and binds to the Buriganga in Mirpur in Dhaka. It is navigable for ships throughout the year.

Religious significance

Tablighi Jamaat, an Islamic origin of the popular movement in South Asia in Dhaka was first removed in the 1950s as Maulana Abdul Aziz and other leaders of the regional headquarters in the mosque near Ramna Park Kakrail.
