

Paragraph on A Village Doctor

A village doctor is a very familiar and popular figure in rural areas. He has no degree in medical science. He has a chamber in his house. There is a chair, an old table, two or three almirahs made of wood, and one or two benches on one side of his chamber. He gets up early in the morning and has his breakfast. Then he starts to meet the patients. He continues to consult with the patient and gives medicine until it is noon. At noon he takes his bath and then takes his lunch. After lunch, he takes a rest for a short while. Then he gets out of the house to attend the calls. Usually, he uses a bicycle to go from one village to another. In the evening he returns home. Then he washes his hands and face and takes refreshment. Then he again starts to meet the patients. He often listens to the problems of the patients and gives them medicine. The villagers trust him and if anyone falls ill he at once rushes to him. He gives treatment to the villagers in return for a very minimal fee. Sometimes he does not demand any fee but he only takes the price of medicine. A village doctor has no assistant. He does everything single-handedly.

Answer: A village doctor is a physician who lives in the village and

gives medical treatment to rural people when they become ill. He is a popular figure in the village. He is familiar to almost all the villagers. He is not a qualified doctor. He is a quack. He starts his career with the experience he had gathered by working with a doctor or in a dispensary. He can deal well with common diseases. He has a dispensary with an Almirah, a chair, a table, and one or two benches. He sits in the dispensary, examines the patients, and gives medicines. He receives the cost of medicine. Then he goes out into the village to see his patients. Generally, he goes on foot. In the absence of any qualified doctor, a village doctor renders useful services to the villagers. He is an important person to them. He is a welcome guest for the rural people as he is readily available at any time to respond to their call.

Answer: A village doctor is a person who gives treatment to the village people at a cheap cost. He is a familiar figure in the villages. Generally, he is not a registered doctor. He receives some

training by working under a qualified doctor for some years. He has a dispensary in his house. He gets up early in the morning and attends to his patients. He treats his patients very carefully. He gives them advice and medicine. After finishing his duty there, he goes out to see other patients in the villages. Sometimes he spends the whole night sitting beside a patient. His presence and affectionate touch fill the patients with hope and courage. He takes small fees from the patients. Sometimes he gives free treatment to the poor. However, a village doctor sometimes does bad to the patients by giving the wrong treatment as he has little knowledge of medicine. Of course, he tries to avoid treating critical patients. Rich people in the village usually avoid going to a village doctor. They call him a quack. But a village doctor is indeed a friend to the villagers. He is always at their side to provide the medical service. He passes a lot of time inquiring about their health condition. He gives them advice free of cost. His treatment fee is very little. So, poor villagers love and honor him very much.

Answer: A person who provides medical treatment to the villagers is known as a village doctor. He is not a well-qualified person. He is not well-versed in medical science. But he is well-experienced. He

gathers experience by working under a qualified doctor in a town or a city. Whenever any person, male or female, or a child becomes sick, he is called in. At once he responds and goes to visit the patient. He rushes to the house of a patient at the moment he is called in. He gives treatment to a patient with sincerity and sympathy. He is honest, sincere, and popular. He is like a friend and relative of the villagers. He gives them treatment, advice, and consolation to the suffering patients. The villagers rely and trust on a village doctor without question. His chamber is located in his house. An isolated room outside the house is used for his chamber and dispensary. The chamber is furnished with an old wooden chair, a table, and two or three worn-out almirahs. Some bottles and tablets are stored in the almirahs. There are two or three benches for the patients to sit on. The doctor has a stethoscope and a pressure machine. He has no assistant. He listens to the complaints of the patients and gives the medicine. He is very popular with the villagers because he is available whenever they need him.
